### **Creative Communities: Wordsworth in Leeds Exhibition**



The exhibition 'Creative Communities: Wordsworth in Leeds' will be on display in Leeds Central library (in the main lending library) from Monday 9th January to Friday 3rd Feb 2017. This is the result of a collaboration between Caring Together, University of Leeds and the Wordsworth Trust alongside some similar work with pupils at Shire Oak Primary School. The exhibition will present images of community. It will include pictures from the Wordsworth Trust archive that capture Grasmere in the 1800s, and these will be contrasted with pictures from the two reading groups in Leeds.
