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# Cost of living - update on energy bills help and major changes to Warm Home Discount

**Latest on help with energy bills:** Government recently announced details of how the £400 rebate will be paid this winter. It will be paid over 6 months from October 2022 to March 2023 and most people will receive it via their electricity supplier. It will be taken off your bills or a reduction in your direct debit if that is the way you pay. Customers on smart prepayment meters will get an automatic credit in the first week of each month.

If you have prepayment meter that you top up with a key/card you will receive 6 separate vouchers by post, email or text so it is important to make sure your supplier has up to date contact details. You can use these to top up at a shop or post office as you normally would. They will have a 3 month expiry date so make sure you use them before this.

For the small number of households who do not have a direct account with their supplier, such as those who pay via their landlords, the government has said it will be making some money available to help but no details announced yet. We are aware this affects some Caring Together members and will be looking out for the details when they come!

Most people on means tested benefits such as pension credit, universal credit, income related ESA should have received £326 in July—the first half of a £650 payment. The next payment of £324 should be arriving in autumn. If you think you should have received this but haven't there is an online form to report on gov.uk. Contact Caring Together if you would like us to help with this.

Leeds City Council distributed most of the household support fund in vouchers to those receiving council tax support and you should have received this if it applies to you. Anyone who needs urgent help with food and household bills can call the local welfare support scheme on 0113 3760330.

Warm Home Discount Scheme changes this year: This scheme is undergoing major changes this year. The amount has increased to £150 but the criteria for who will get it has changed. People receiving guarantee pension credit will continue get it automatically. If you get any other means tested benefits (including housing benefit) you may be entitled to receive it if you have 'high energy costs' (there has been no definite information of this yet). This potentially means around 750,000 extra people could get it. You should get a letter from your supplier in October telling you if you qualify.

However, anyone on a disability benefit such as Attendance Allowance, PIP or DLA who do get any means tested benefits will no longer receive this discount (although you will get another £150 cost of living payment this winter).

If you do not get a letter in October but think you should be eligible for this you can call the helpline on 0800 731 0214 or ask Caring Together to look at it with you.

#### Scam Warning—be alert for cost of living and energy rebate scams

Criminals are trying to take advantage of the cost of living crisis by targeting people with scams around the cost of living payments and energy rebates. Please be aware that the cost of living payments will be paid automatically so if you receive a message or a call claiming to be from the DWP and asking you to give details to claim it is a scam.

Similarly, there are a number of messages/calls saying they are from Ofgem about the £400 energy rebate. Ofgem are <u>not giving</u> out the rebate it will come directly from your electricity supplier and you do not need to claim

Please be aware of these and do not give out any details.

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# Last date to use old style £20 (and £50) notes

It's 2 years since the new polymer notes were introduced and if you still have any of the old style paper notes you will not be able to use them in shops after 30th September 2022.

After this date you may be able to pay them into your bank account either at the branch or over the counter at a Post Office. Most banks will accept them.

Caring Together has a small 'library' of books, magazines, Dvds, Cds and even knitting patterns in our office that you can borrow (or swap).

And there are some lovely handmade cards too.

We also have some non perishable food items for people to take if they wish.

We even have some Covid lateral flow tests!

There is no charge for any of these, however there is a money box for any donation you may wish to make. Feel free to have a look when you visit us. If you want to donate any items let us know.
